J. DiAngelo's work White Fragility: Why It's So Hard for White People to Talk About Racism. Zoom discussions facilitated by Pastor Nanette and Pastor Debbie, will be held on Wednesdays in July from 7-8:30pm as we read through the book. In White Fragility, antiracist educator Robin DiAngelo deftly illuminates the phenomenon of white fragility and "allows us to understand racism as a practice not restricted to 'bad people' (Claudia Rankine)." Referring to the defensive moves that white people make when challenged racially, white fragility is characterized by emotions such as anger, fear, and guilt, and by behaviors including argumentation and silence. These behaviors, in turn, function to reinstate white racial equilibrium and prevent any meaningful cross-

racial dialogue. Books are available on <u>Amazon</u> and Kindle e-Readers, or can be sourced from your favorite bookseller.
